- II. MEMBERSHIP DUES Membership and subscriptions run on a calendar year from January 1 through December 31. If you join ESA in the middle of the calendar year, you will receive the current year's back issues (*Frontiers* back issues are not sent automatically, they must be requested). Please select only one category of membership. PLEASE RENEW BY DECEMBER 31, 2014 TO AVOID A LAPSE IN SERVICES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.
 - Developing Countries This membership category is available to individuals who are both citizens of a developing country and are currently residing in that country. The developing country categories include membership dues and subscriptions to the journals and a student membership which receives an online only subscription to Frontiers in Ecology and the Environment.
 - Emeritus Member This membership category is available to individuals who have been members of the society for 30 years AND who are currently retired. Membership dues and a subscription to *Frontiers* are complimentary *ad infinitum*. Subscriptions are available at the current rates. Please check your eligibility with the Membership Manager at tanya@esa.org BEFORE signing up for this member type.
 - Life Member This category is available to members who pay a lump sum to the Society. Payment may be made at one time or divided equally over a three year period. Types include lifetime membership with a lifetime subscription to all journals plus the ESA/JSTOR Archive online only, or lifetime membership with the option to add print & online access to one or more journal(s). Lifetime membership must be selected before lifetime subscriptions may be added.
 - . Contributing Member This membership category is available to individuals who wish to provide an additional level of annual support.
- **III. SUBSCRIPTIONS** Journal subscriptions run on a calendar year from January 1 through December 31. In order to receive the journals at the member rate, payment of membership dues is required.  - ESA/JSTOR Electronic Archive: Members can now enjoy convenient, easily searchable electronic access to archival volumes of all past ESA journals through 1997 including *Ecology, Ecological Applications, Ecological Monographs,* and the *ESA Bulletin.* The ESA/JSTOR Electronic Archive also allows subscribers to search full text and interface with current online subscriptions.

 - Buell Award The Murray F. Buell Award is given annually to a student for an outstanding oral presentation at the ESA Annual Meeting.
 - Braun Award The E. Lucy Braun Award is given annually to a student for an outstanding poster presentation at the ESA Annual Meeting.
 - Cooper Award The William Skinner Cooper Award is given annually to the author(s) of a recent publication in Ecology with special emphasis on geobotany, physiographic ecology, plant succession, or the distribution of plants along environmental gradients.
 - Deevey Award The Edward S. Deevey Award is given to a student for an outstanding oral or poster presentation on a paleoecology topic at the ESA Annual Meeting.
 - Forrest Shreve Award This student research fund is given to a student for basic or applied ecological research on deserts of the southwestern United States and/or northwestern Mexico.
 - Jay Anderson Award Supports programs and activities related to ecosystems of the West and Pacific Northwest.
 - MacArthur Award The Robert MacArthur Award is given bi-annually to an established ecologist in mid-career for meritorious contributions to the field of ecology.
 - Mercer Award The George Mercer Award is given annually for an outstanding ecological research paper written by a younger ecologist.
 - . Odum Excellence in Ecology Education Award Given annually to recognize an ecologist for outstanding work in ecology education.
 - Eugene P. Odum Award of the Southeast Chapter Given to a student for an outstanding paper presented on an ecological topic at the annual meeting of the Association of Southern Biologists.
 - Sustainability Science Award Given annually to the authors of a paper published in the past five years that makes the greatest contribution to the science of sustainability through the integration of ecological and social sciences.
 - Ton Damman Award Given by the Vegetation Section to a student for an outstanding presentation on plant community ecology at the ESA Annual Meeting.
 - Tom M. Frost Award Given annually by the Aquatic Ecology Section for outstanding graduate research in aquatic ecology as demonstrated in a recently published paper.
 - Whittaker Award The Robert H. Whittaker Award is given to outstanding foreign ecologists to help defray the costs of travel to the United State for visiting colleagues and/or attending and ESA Annual Meeting.
