On behalf of the Ecological Society of America, the world's largest society of professional ecologists, we thank you for all of your hard work crafting the FY17 appropriations bills. We strongly encourage you to complete the FY17 appropriations process this year and avoid continuing resolutions that will hinder our nation's scientific enterprise. Under a continuing resolution, agencies are unable to award new grants, plan new missions, and budget appropriately. Continuing resolutions stifle American innovation and competitiveness and cost our federal science agencies valuable time, money, and resources.

Additionally, while we recognize the fiscal constraints facing Congress, we are concerned about the essentially flat funding for NSF, NOAA, USGS, and biological science programs within the Department of Energy.

Strong, robust, and predictable investment in America's scientific enterprise remains one of the surest ways to encourage economic growth, increase the safety of our nation and its citizens, and advance our understanding of the world around us.

Thank you for your support for the ecological and biological sciences, and we look forward to continuing to work with you to strengthen the American scientific enterprise.
