

BRAUN AWARD

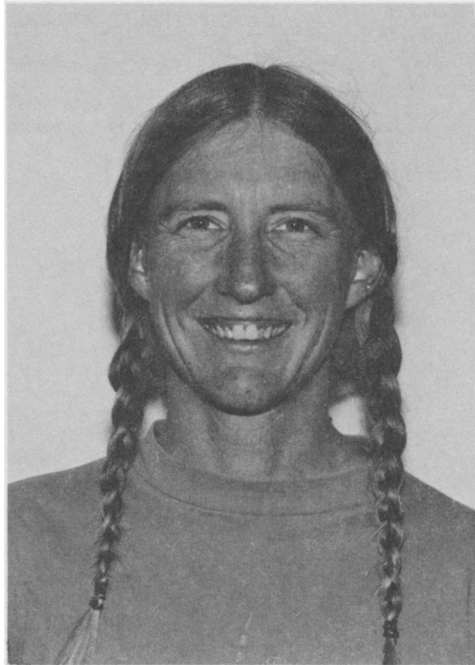
Barbara A. Roy

E. Lucy Braun was an eminent plant ecologist and the first woman president of the Ecological Society of America. Besides describing and mapping the deciduous forest regions of eastern North America, Lucy Braun served as a dedicated teacher and role model to her students. To honor her, this award is presented to a student for the outstanding

poster presentation at the Society's annual meeting.

The 1990 winner of the award is Barbara A. Roy for her poster, "Pollinator theft by a fungus," based on research done at the Rocky Mountain Biological Laboratory. Bitty Roy received her bachelor's degree from Evergreen State College and her master's degree from

Southern Illinois University. She is currently working toward her doctorate at Rancho Santa Ana Botanic Garden, Claremont, California. Her advisor is Dr. Paulette Bierzychudek at Pomona College.

Receiving honorable mention citations for posters are Bruce K. Orr of the University of California–Berkeley for his paper, “Interactions among aquatic macrophytes, predators, and mosquitoes,” and Elizabeth J. Queathem of the University of Utah for her paper, “The mechanical causes of ontogenetic fluctuations in jumping ability in the grasshopper *Schistocerca americana*.”
