

PRESIDENT JOHN E. CANTLON

Dr. John E. Cantlon, professor of botany and plant pathology, joined the Michigan State University faculty in September 1954.

Dr. Cantlon has done extensive research on Arctic vegetation, in addition to studying plant life in Michigan.

Before coming to Michigan State he was on the faculty of George Washington University, 1950-54.

A native of Sparks, Nev., Dr. Cantlon was born October 6, 1921. He received the B.S. degree from the University of Nevada in 1947 and the Ph.D. from Rutgers University in 1950.

Dr. Cantlon has been the national secretary of the Ecological Society of America (1958-62) and a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He is a member of the Advisory Committee on Environmental Biology, National Science Foundation. He served on the editorial board of Ecology, professional publication, from 1955 to 1957 and was editor of the Bulletin of the Ecological Society of America from 1958 through 1961.

He is the author and coauthor of numerous articles in periodicals and journals.
