

Clyde Powell Stroud 1922-1952

Clyde P. Stroud, Associate Biologist, Division of Biological and Medical Research, Argonne National Laboratory, died on October 8, 1952.

A native of Shreveport, Louisiana, he did his undergraduate work at New Mexico Highlands University. He completed his Master's degree at the same institution in 1948. In 1951, he received the Ph. D. degree at the University of Chicago. Upon completion of his graduate work at the University of Chicago, he joined the staff of the Argonne National Laboratory where, until his death, he conducted research on the toxicology and biological action of fast neutrons. During this short period, he showed promise of becoming one the leaders in quantitative biology.

In addition to the Ecological Society of America, Dr. Stroud was a member of the Entomological Society of America, the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Chicago Chapter of the Society of the Sigma Xi, and the American Society of Zoologists.
